

Working Visit of the Deputy Prime Minister for Reintegration to Ștefan Vodă District



On September 15, 2026, the Deputy Prime Minister for Reintegration, Valeriu Chiveri, accompanied by Larisa Voloh, Member of the Parliament of the Republic of Moldova, paid a working visit to Ștefan Vodă district. Discussions held at the district council with representatives of local public authorities and deconcentrated services focused on the current situation in the region, the primary challenges facing the communities, as well as addressing pressing issues in areas such as infrastructure, education, healthcare, the provision of quality public services, and local development.

The wide range of public services utilized by the inhabitants of the Transnistrian region on the right bank of the Nistru River was also highlighted. A significant number of residents from the left bank of the Nistru River are registered with family doctors on the right bank, where they receive medical assistance, compensated medicines, and other forms of state support. In the Family Doctor Center of Răscăieți village alone, more than 1,200 residents from the left bank of the Nistru River receive medical services within the national healthcare system. Furthermore, children from the region are integrated into the national educational system, attending general education institutions, including schools and kindergartens on the right bank. Meanwhile, residents from the Transnistrian region apply daily to the constitutional authorities to obtain national-model identity cards and other documents.

During the visit to the villages of Răscăieți and Cioburciu, located within the perimeter of the Security Zone, the Deputy Prime Minister reviewed the situation in the communities and the progress of projects implemented with the support of the Program of Activities for the Reintegration of the Country. Among the projects supported this year are repair and reconstruction works on local houses of culture, which play an important role in the social and cultural life of these settlements.

„The development of villages and ensuring access to quality public services represent important components of the country's reintegration process. Direct presence on the ground allows us to learn about people's needs firsthand and to jointly identify concrete solutions,” noted Deputy Prime Minister Valeriu Chiveri during discussions with representatives of the communities.

At the conclusion of the discussions and the working visit, the Deputy Prime Minister and local government representatives expressed a shared commitment to consolidate interaction across a wide spectrum of issues, aiming to create better living conditions for the residents of both banks of the Nistru River.
