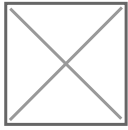


Royal House of Romania reaffirms support for Moldova's European integration



The Royal House of Romania will continue to support Moldova on its path toward European integration and the implementation of modernization projects. Statements to this effect today were made at a meeting between Prime Minister Alexandru Munteanu, Her Majesty Margareta, Custodian of the Romanian Crown, and His Royal Highness Prince Radu.

The officials praised the close friendship between Moldova and Romania and the fruitful cooperation in joint projects in economy, administration, education, culture, and sustainable development.

Prime Minister Alexandru Munteanu expressed gratitude for Romania's consistent support offered for Moldova. He said: „Moldova continues to count on the support of the Royal House of Romania, including in European capitals, for our European integration aspirations. Citizens on both sides of the Prut River benefit when we build bridges together in education, research, culture, healthcare, social or humanitarian fields".

The Premier highlighted the success of the Moldovan-Romanian economic forum, held in Chisinau under the patronage of the Royal House.
